- caliphs, followed by the era of the ministers

- Show the most important battles that the Arab Muslims fought against the Crusaders.
- Introduce the student to the most prominent figures of the Ayyubid state, including the leader Salah al-Din al-Ayyubi
- Read a model of the internal and external relations of the Ayyubid state
- Introduce the student to the reasons that hastened the fall of the Ayyubid state
