S + has + p.p. + ... have	<i>She has written a letter.</i> <i>I have done my homework.</i>
Action happened at <b>an indefinite time</b> in the past	<i>He has written many stories.</i>
An action/state began in the <b>past</b> & continues to the <b>present</b> .	<i>How long have you worked as a teacher?</i>
An <b>experience</b> as part of someone's life.	<i>Have you ever been to Rome?</i> <i>He has never been abroad.</i>
A past action with <b>results in the present</b> .	<i>The taxi has arrived.</i> (It's outside the door now)
<i>For</i> is used with a period of time <i>Since</i> with a point in time.	<i>We've lived in Kyfa for three years.</i> <i>She has worked there since 2006.</i>
<i>Yet</i> is used in the questions & negatives.	<i>Has your passport arrived yet?</i> <i>I haven't met him yet.</i>
<b>Past Simple:</b> action happened at a <b>definite time</b> in the past. <b>Present Perfect:</b> action happened at an <b>indefinite time</b> in the past.	<i>I lived in Southampton in 1992.</i> <i>He has written three books.</i>
